The Tests

Saxoncourt Tests for Young Learners of English are a series of comprehension based examinations for children. They are suitable for students of approximately 6 years of age to 12, or those attending mainstream Primary (Elementary) and the first year of Secondary (Junior High) school. There are six levels.

The tests examine children's listening and reading skills through a variety of enjoyable tasks. These tasks may include coloring, for which candidates must bring a set of coloring pencils to the exam. The colors required are: black, blue, brown, green, orange, pink, purple, red, white and yellow. Other tasks could include multiple choice questions, where candidates are asked to tick the appropriate box, for example; drawing hands on a clock; identifying pictures and/or words and numbering them; identifying pictures and/or words and drawing circles around them and drawing lines linking words and pictures. With the occasional exception of simple coloring exercises, each section includes an example clearly illustrating the task. Written instructions have been omitted in favor of pictorial icons that explain simply what the candidate is expected to do.

Some of the tasks (e.g. linking exercises) have a color guide to encourage students to use different colors. This is for ease of marking only and it is not important that candidates match the colors exactly. In coloring exercises where the instruction is *blue*, for example, light blue or dark blue are equally acceptable.

The tests are divided into several sections, each with a distinct task. The maximum possible scores for the tests are 300 for levels 1 and 2, 400 for levels 3 and 4 and 500 for levels 5 and 6. All candidates receive a certificate from Saxoncourt Examinations indicating their total score together with a grade of one, two or three lions. One lion suggests that the candidate was not ready for this level and should try it again after additional study. Two lions indicate an average pass. Candidates with this grade will be prepared to attempt the next level after some further study. Three lions is given to candidates who should be able to succeed at the next level with a minimum of further preparation.

As a general guide, Level 1 is appropriate for children no younger than six who have studied English for a minimum of 50 hours. Level 2 assumes about 100 hours and Level 3 about 150 of study. Level 4 is a suitable entry point for children from the age of ten who have studied for about 100 hours. There is a steady increase in vocabulary and grammatical structures through the levels, and while candidates attempting Level 1 are only expected to be able to read a small proportion the syllabus, Level 6 candidates should be able to read all listed items.

The Syllabus

The syllabus comprises two sections. The first consists of a description of each of the six levels. Each level includes a list of new structures and a vocabulary list of new words divided into words that students should be able to read and those that they need only recognize when heard, together with a thematic list showing new words by theme.

The second section includes the language items of the entire syllabus, listed thematically and alphabetically. In the thematic lists, the phrases and structures are listed separately. The level at which the item first appears is also indicated in this section. This section also lists all words alphabetically and shows the level where the word first appears.

The word lists at any particular level do not necessarily include words that only appear in set phrases or structures. Thus the word "color" (noun) does not appear as a separate word until Level 5, although the phrase, "What color is it?" has already been encountered at Level 1.

Verbs in the word lists should be known in affirmative, negative and interrogative forms for all tenses included in the syllabus at that level, and in all persons unless otherwise indicated. It is assumed that candidates will know imperative forms of all verbs in the syllabus. Nouns should be recognized in both singular and plural forms. While both full and contracted forms (What is this? and What's this?) are used in the tests only contracted forms are written in the syllabus.

Although the language lists are quite exhaustive, other incidental language may appear in the tests, but this language will not need to be understood in order to carry out the tasks required. In addition candidates should be familiar with:

Common English names

Names of major English speaking countries

Nationalities of people from English speaking countries

These may be included in reading sections at levels 5 and 6.

While every effort has been made to make the tasks self-explanatory, the following rubric words may be used and should be recognized by the candidates:
